The following is a list of most of the species of butterflies that have been documented in the Palos Verdes Peninsula area in recent years. Most can be seen during the summer, and a few are visible all year. Species marked with “S” are those that are primarily visible only during spring, mainly mid Feb. through April. Those species with strong associations to their host plants have the name of the major (or sole) host plant in parenthesis. By completing this checklist you can help us monitor the presence of species in our area and thus help assess the ecological health of the area. An asterisk indicates a very rare species, generally out of its range in our area.
